Example of an Eight Hour Day for an RNA •3.5 hours restorative dining between breakfast & lunch (treatments for self feeding, dysphagia, etc.) •3 hours of individual restorative resident care &/or restorative programming (groups, etc.) •.5 hours for documentation •.5 hours for two fifteen minute breaks

What comes to mind when you think of a RNP?

As represented in the table below, the addition of restorative for the nursing RUG PBC1 changes the RUG to PBC2 and increases the CMI from 1.13 to 1.22. Respectively, the second table represents an example of the effect on the PDPM reimbursement rate. In this case example, there was an increase of \$9.10/day.

Documenting Nursing Rehabilitation/Restorative Care (P3)

•Defined skilled services - skilled nursing 7 days/week, PT/OT/ST at least 5 days/week •Skilled Care Maintain the patients current condition or prevent or slow further deterioration •Daily skilled documentation is necessary to describe the skilled required •Nursing services are considered skilled when they are so inherently complex that
