7 Ways to Scaffold Instruction for English Language Learners

Scaffolding is a method in which the teacher supports a student to work just beyond the level he could achieve on his own. Psychologist Lev Vygotsky called this area the "zone of proximal development." As the student becomes more competent, the support is gradually removed until the student is able to perform the task without assistance.

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Verbal Scaffolds This type of scaffold provides prompts, questions, and elaboration to facilitate students' movement to higher levels of language proficiency, comprehension, and thinking. The combination of the verbal scaffolds with effective teacher-student interaction promotes confidence, which in turn leads to language competence.

Scaffolding is breaking up the learning into chunks and providing a tool, or structure, with each chunk. When scaffolding reading, for example, you might preview the text and discuss key vocabulary, or chunk the text and then read and discuss as you go. With differentiation, you might give a child an entirely different piece of text to read, or shorten the text or alter it, or modify the writing assignment that follows.

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Scaffolding Language Learning Teachers and other adults modify their language to match the language level of students. This type of modification is called "scaffolding." All students (including adults) learn better when the teacher scaffolds or adjusts his/her instruction to the level of the student.

Scaffolding the Academic Success of Adolescent English

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Scaffolding is important for EAL learners as it enables them to move from dependent to independent learning, as emphasised by NALDIC (1999). They gradually take over more of a task until they can do it without the expert's support. They can then move onto more challenging learning which continues to be scaffolded by the expert.
